

Kaibab Band of Paiute Indians Energy Fuels Scholarship Fund

Description of Scholarship

The Energy Fuels Scholarship Fund was created in February 1992 for the sole benefit of qualified members of the Kaibab Paiute Tribe who demonstrate a high aptitude in **mathematics, science, or engineering**. The Tribal Council will award one student per year in the amount of \$5000 payable in installments of \$2500 per semester (Fall and Spring) paid directly to the college or university. Funds may be used to cover the cost of tuition, books, and living expenses. The Energy Fuels Scholarship Fund does not automatically renew and must be applied for and awarded each year.

Scholarship Eligibility

- Applicants must provide official documentation demonstrating that they are an enrolled member of the Kaibab Band of Paiute Indians.
- Applicants must be enrolled in an accredited Bachelor's, Master's, or Doctoral program in the field of **mathematics, science, or engineering**.
- Applicants must have at least 60 credit hours to be eligible for the Energy Fuels scholarship.
- Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of at least a **3.0**.

Application Deadline

- June 30th each year for Fall and Spring semesters


Application Requirements

- Applicants must complete the Energy Fuels Scholarship Fund application.
- Applicants must be eligible for and complete the Kaibab Paiute Higher Education Application for funding which includes completion of the FASFA, the Financial Needs Analysis, and submission of current transcripts showing a **cumulative GPA of at least 3.0**, copy of CIB, and a letter of acceptance from college or university.
- Applicants must have a signed degree plan from the college or university of their choice showing enrollment in classes that will fulfill a degree in mathematics, science, or engineering.
- All Energy Fuels applicants are required to submit an essay as part of the Energy Fuels Scholarship Fund application process. This essay is specific to this scholarship. This essay is evaluated by scholarship reviewers and it is expected to be **750 words** and address educational and/or career goals, interest in and motivation to continue higher education, demonstrate an understanding of the importance of college and the student's commitment to complete the educational program undertaken, and demonstrate the student's plan or desire to make a difference in or impact their community.
- Applicants must submit **TWO** letters of recommendation. Letters from a teacher, professor, employer, advisor from school, and/or a non-related adult in your community who knows you well is suggested.
- Applicants must submit the required application and necessary documents by the **deadline of June 30th** to be considered for the scholarship.

- Applicants must complete the Student Community Service Plan outlining a project of service to the Kaibab Band of Paiute Indians in the amount of 15 hours. The Student Community Service Plan must be complete upon application, while the service project must be completed within 12 months of funding.

Application Process

- Students will submit their completed applications by the **June 30th deadline**.
- If only one student applies for the scholarship, the Education Director and Education Committee will review the application for completeness and then forward the name of the applicant to the Tribal Council for award approval.
- If more than one student applies for the scholarship, the Education Director and Education Committee will create a scholarship committee consisting of 3 Tribal Council members and 2 Education Committee members. The committee will use the Scholarship Rubric to score the scholarship applicants. The applicant with the highest score will be forwarded on to the Tribal Council for award approval.



The essay will attempt to address educational and/or career goals, interest in and motivation to continue higher education, demonstrate an understanding of the importance of college and the student's commitment to complete the educational program undertaken, and demonstrate the student's plan or desire to make a difference in or impact their community. A proficient essay will not address all components.	A marginal essay will have less than 750 words. The essay will reflect the student's inability to write down their thoughts and will contain many spelling, punctuation, and grammar mistakes. The essay will not adequately address educational and/or career goals, interest in and motivation to continue higher education, demonstrate an understanding of the importance of college and the student's commitment to complete the educational program undertaken, and demonstrate the student's plan or desire to make a difference in or impact their community. A marginal essay will be missing many or all of the necessary components.
